Dear Trinity Family,

As I write my final article for the *Tidings*, it has just been a few days since the members of our Properties Ministry Team completed their annual pruning of the beautiful Crape Myrtles that line our property. If you know anything about these wonderful plants, their display truly reflects the four seasons in their life-cycle. The most difficult and mysterious season is the pruning one when the branches are cut back to the trunk. They're not very pretty at this point, but everyone knows with spring they'll blossom once again stronger and healthier than before. It confirms the fact, "God has made everything beautiful for its own time...and people cannot see the whole scope of God's work from beginning to end."

You called me 8.5 years ago to serve as your Associate Pastor and over that time we have journeyed together through a variety of different seasons where we couldn't see the whole scope of God's work from beginning to end. I think back to our Small Group Ministries, the community partnership forming Trinity South, the COVID Pandemic, the land purchase in Bushnell, the retirement of Pastor Dan, the Intentional Interim Ministry with Pastor Schoolcraft, a new Constitution and By-Laws, and the implementation of the new Accountable Leader Model for effective mission and ministry in sharing the Gospel throughout the world, and now calling a new Pastor.

As the writer to Ecclesiastes notes, "it's all about the season of life when God makes all things beautiful for its own time." I have always been a firm believer that God calls His pastors to meet the specific needs of His Church for a particular time, place, history, and purpose that we may or may not see, but we can take comfort the Church is in His hands. I feel especially blessed in these final days of my ministry knowing and seeing why God called me to Trinity Lutheran for sharing these seasons with you. New spiritual foundations have been laid and are ready for building. Spring is around the corner! Trinity is ready to blossom into something new and beautiful made by God!

How do I know? Jesus said in John 15:1-5, "I am the true Vine and my Father is the gardener. He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit He trims clean so that it will be even more fruitful. You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. Remain in Me, and I will remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself, it must remain in the Vine. I thank God for calling me into the ministry and the many people and congregations who've supported me along the way. Thank you for the privilege and opportunity I've had to serve as your Pastor. I want to thank our staff and Ministry Leadership Teams for their servant hearts and tireless dedication to the challenges and opportunities we've shared together in mission and ministry. My last Sunday preaching will be on March 2 and final day of employment will be March 10, 2025.

Finally, I want to thank my wife Kimberley, for all of her love and support through these 38 years of ministry we've shared together as a team. She's always "been my better half" as the members of my vicarage church always pointed out, and I'd agree with them. Now, in these final days of my ministry, I just ask that you would pray for Kimberley and I, and our family, as we make our final preparations and celebrate this new season of life.

Established in 2003, the Community of Gratitude, Inc. located behind the Ocklawaha United Methodist Church at 13335 Volkmann Avenue, Ocklawaha, provided food to 12 households in the first month. Currently they serve 822 households and 2,657 individuals in the following zip codes: Ocklawaha 32183, 32179; Weirsdale 32195; East Lake Weir 32133; The Forest/Silver Springs 34488 and Umatilla 32784.

When the neighbors, previously referred to as clients, approach the facilities they are met by a trained volunteer who completes an intake interview to verify their eligibility. If the family does not reside in the above zip code area they are provided a document whereupon they can scan a code, showing an area that they may utilize. A qualified family may come once a month for food.

The facility currently has approximately 70 volunteers and can always use more help in assisting those in need. They need volunteers to organize and stock items, place food items into grocery boxes, deliver boxes to the vehicles, conduct intake of new neighbors, enter information into the database, and other administrative duties.

Trinity Lutheran provides volunteers who deliver our donations and may also assist in the facility. The donations are delivered every Tuesday morning from 10:00 AM to 12:00 PM, Thursday-1:00 PM to 3:00 PM, and Saturday-10:00 AM to 12:00 PM. The sign up list is located in the Narthex, HOWEVER, we are blessed in that we have volunteers who have volunteered for each month in 2025.

The Community of Gratitude is seeking volunteers who can volunteer their time to help on the open dates at the facility. You may contact Jim Steinmark via the church officer or contact Director Sharon Brewer directly at 352-288-3499 for further information.



A Note from Trinity's Sewing Angels

The Sewing Angels love nothing more than distribution day!

December 5th was a big one for us! We took care of the young and old!

We divided all the items we had sewn for children's and baby charities evenly between: Heathy Families, Alpha Center for Women, Shephard's Lighthouse, The Pregnancy Center, and the Infant and Toddler Pantry.

Totals for the 5 deliveries:

68 Quilts, 20 burp cloths, 45 crib sheets, and 265 baby washcloths. Leslie Adams from the Infant and Toddler Pantry from the Congregational Church in Gummerfield came to our meeting to tell us about their outreach.

Also on December 5th we put together a few items for the Gherriff's Department of Marion County, which included 3 camp style blankets, 3 quilts, and 3 children's quilts.



I have a neighbor who distributes items to bring cheer to the forgotten at nursing homes. We put together a bag of items for her as well. It contained 10 crocheted lap robes, 10 walker bags, and 15 senior bibs.

Gigi's house received 14 headbands, 4 small toys, 4 pillow cases a & 236 Christmas card ornaments. Member Julia Mack found out about 2 very worthy charities that were in need of prayer shawls from her friend Tami. Julia reached out to Trinity's Prayer Shawl ministry and they kindly donated shawls for Julia to distribute.

Hand 'n Hand Recovery is a top rated inpatient drug Treatment Center in nearby Eustis and 13 prayer shawls were also provided for this ministry

Beyond the Walls Food Pantry, a ministry of Heritage Christian Church of Fruitland Park was the other recipient of 95 prayer shawls and 4 crocheted blankets. They have a prayer team that prays with the recipients when they receive their food. At Christmas time they bless them with a bible and a prayer shawl.

We are so blessed by giving to all these wonderful charities and by all the hands that put their love into making all the items, and those who donate materials to help us carry on our ministry! The following week we had our annual Christmas party and after enjoying some food and fellowship we entertained ourselves by working together on creating some quilt kits.

Our current focus is making blankets from heavier weight fabrics. Many hands help make the labor light! Come join us. We meet every Thursday from 9am-12:00pm.


TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH CHRISTIAN CANCER CARE BLESSINGS MINISTRY

The Christian Cancer Care Blessings (CCCB) project is a ministry of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) of Trinity Lutheran Church (TLC) striving to make living with cancer more comfortable through God's love and blessings.



We have been very busy packing and distributing care bags. Each bag contained a Pocket Prayer Book or N.T. Bible, a Cancer Pamphlet, a colorful bookmark and scripture message along with hand lotion and lip balm, and a special personal note of encouragement. Also included were donated items such as boxed teas, sugar free cough drops, hard candy, puzzle books, mechanical pencils, and non-skid socks. There were beautiful handmade lap blankets, crosses and hearts, and small bags containing a port pillow and a tissue holder. All items donated and made with love.

Remember that **YOU** are a part of this ministry. Cancer Care bags can be picked up at the Welcome Desk, at no charge, and can be delivered in person to someone needing God's comfort. If you would like us to send a bag out of state, please leave the name and address information at the Welcome Desk and someone will send it for you, also at no cost. Recently, we have mailed care bags to New Jersey, New York and Michigan.



This is an ongoing ministry and we will need to replenish our supplies. Supplies donated and/or handmade by you can be dropped off in Room 4. Our bin is located in the back and marked CCCB.
